Dr. Joseph Vitale, author of *The Miracle: Six Steps to Enlightenment* has summarized a few of his reflections on belief. I do extensive research on lived experience in the realm of belief, especially as it distinguishes itself from thoughts or feelings. I would add my own premise to this reflection that we may rightly seek to align our beliefs with those of the official teachings of the Church, but we need to know the belief we have NOW in our daily life. It might be a variation or a composite of aspects that we have learned or adopted that are beyond what is taught; nevertheless it's having a big impact on our life in how we choose to engage in the world around us.

Vitale suggests that "behind every behavior is a belief." I've adjusted and combined some of his reflections with my own to provide a set of principles to frame a spiritual self-awareness process that might be helpful in seeing your faith-based actions (and, I would argue, we are called by the Gospel of Jesus Christ to make all our actions "faith-inspired"), applying them well to the choices, attitudes and interactions with others, so that you are endeavoring to give your most authentic Christian witness in the world.

Whenever you are confused about why you did something, look for a "belief" that you hold on to that is motivating it. Once you know what belief you're operating from, you might be able to guide the behavior to more effectively and authentically demonstrate your beliefs, or even adjust your choice entirely setting aside the type of belief you have if it doesn't accurately apply to what you're doing.

Beliefs – unacknowledged or not recognized with in you – have the power to compel you to do what you might otherwise think is wrong or inconsistent with your values. I'd like to think that much of the evil in the world is mistakes that people make. Their motives are sometimes right on target, but their choice to respond to their motives is not going to be advantageous or spiritually authentic. (Dr. Vitale calls such behavior "stupid," but I'd like to see it with less harshness or judgement, although, sometimes we need to allow ourselves to be corrected by the tenants of our faith.)
