Some Christian spiritual writers have used metaphors to describe what it means for us to be members of the faith community gathered in God's name as the Church. Among my favorites is from Saint Augustine, one of the early believers who was called to study and write theological texts. Among his greatest works is the City of God and among his most famous quotes is that we who believe might think of the Church as a "hospital for sinners." One thing that can draw others to be a part of our worship is how we talk about its importance in our lives. If we give out the message that we need the special blessings and strength from our fellow believers we can receive when we worship together, and if we share an understanding that we are aware of how important it is that we are committed to being there to add to the blessing and strength others receive from our presence, we might invite others to learn about what we gain from being a part of our faith community and they might come to see it as well. We gain much from being available for the blessings of worshiping together. We also bless others when we are present for worship. Making our participation in the liturgy a priority of our week is sometimes difficult, but there is much that Jesus teaches and much evidence in the Christian Scriptures and in the early writings of the Church that can give us strength, encouragement and a sense of calling to help us to persevere in finding space in our week to worship for the Sunday Eucharist.

Going to church for the liturgy is an act of acknowledgement that we need help that God alone can give. Going to Church is a faithful disciple's response to Jesus' words in the Gospel of Matthew: "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst." Jesus consistently refers to the importance of the disciples' remaining together, especially after the Resurrection. We study the passages in the Gospels and in the Acts of the Apostles where the disciples are uncertain, fearful, or otherwise hesitant to remain close together with special focus in the liturgical season of Easter. Among them is when Jesus instructs Mary Magdalene to go from the empty tomb on Easter morning. She becomes the first disciple to see the Resurrected Jesus and in going forth to the Church—the community of believers together in Jesus' name—Mary Magdalene is commissioned by Jesus to an apostle to the apostles. Then later, when Cleopas and his fellow disciple were leaving on their own toward Emmaus, Jesus appears to them, first walking with them, then, breaking bread at table with them. They suddenly understand what their hearts were leading them to recognize—that it was Jesus. Part of the lesson is that our personal vision of Jesus is not God's will for us to seek or enjoy for its own sake. We are not as we are called to be as believers in Jesus' message when we are isolated, either physically or ideologically, away from the community of our fellow believers. The beauty of the Holy Week and Easter liturgies are part of how we are strengthened as Jesus' disciples today. I pray that we can walk together as much as possible as a community of faith. I pray that we each recognize Jesus' call that we commit over and over to being present to each other here at Saint Stephen's and that we allow the grace of God to illumine us when we are led astray by our own will, disappointments, sorrows, sullen with wishes that the world could be different, or even when good things happen in our life, and return to worship with our hearts ready to be healed, our belief in God's all-sufficient grace, and in the power of the Holy Spirit to sanctify us and, through us, to make the Church more visible, more known and a greater blessing to the world.
