We welcome Gerald Warrick to the Parish House for his ministry of outreach to students in the community and beyond who seek to become athletes in basketball. Gerald grew up in this area then used his skill at basketball to play professionally in Europe — in Montenegro and Serbia — with the Gusinje Strsljen team for two years, then later became a member of the world-famous "Harlem Wizards" team and played with them for six years. He recalls leading the 4th of July parades in Monroeville and Penn Hills for several years, "spinning a basketball" to spread joy and love with his talent in the sport of basketball. After the COVID-19 pandemic is behind us, Gerald plans to promote the Harlem Wizards as a team member by presenting assemblies at local schools and events. Recently Gerald established his own company to teach basketball as an outreach ministry to the youth in the Pittsburgh area.

Now Gerald has connected with Saint Stephen's. He wants to use his talent and professional skill to help young people to succeed in the academic work as well as in the sports that are a part of their school curriculum. Gerald wants to share the blessings he received from mentors when he was growing up here and pass them on to the next generation. Furthermore, Gerald has moved into Wilkinsburg with his family recently, so he's right nearby. His ministry is focused on at-risk young people in particular, and we're honored that Gerald has decided to make Saint Stephen's Parish House the site to make this ministry a reality. We welcome Gerald and the young people he'll be training and working with individually and in small groups. We look forward to a long relationship with Gerald here at St. Stephen's and this important outreach ministry to at-risk youth as an extension of our parish.
