Their vision is to provide families with support in caring for their young children when they need it most, creating a community that is a safe and nurturing place for all children to thrive. They offer emergency childcare for children ages 0 to 6 who can stay with them for a few hours or a few days based on the needs of each individual family. Families have used Jeremiah's Place for emergencies, such as escape from abuse and respite. It is an invaluable gift for single mothers. Palm Sunday (bishop's visitation) is March 28. Easter is April 4.

Heavenly Father, Thank you for the gift of this season. Thank you for knowing our hearts and our need for rhythms in our lives, and for drawing us into a deeper communion with you throughout the coming 40 days.

Lord, it can be disheartening to read on Ash Wednesday that all come from dust, and to dust all return, yet we know that there is more to our stories. We know that you created man and woman from the dust at the very beginning of time and that you breathed life into them to transform them into living creatures. We know that you are in the business of resurrection-- your very Son went to the cross to show us that no death is final and that ultimate transformation comes through your gift of salvation. Though we were made from dust, and our bodies will return to dust again, we can live in eternal glory with you through the blood of your Son.

May we remember the gift of salvation in this season. May these weeks leading up to the tragedy of Good Friday and the glory of Resurrection Sunday remind us of who you are, how you love us, and who you have created us to be as your followers. May we walk through this season intentionally, removing distractions that take our gaze away from your glory. May we quiet the noise that pulls us from adoration of you and puts our attention on lesser things. May we simplify where we have been stressed, may we surrender what has been burdensome, may we repent of what has been sinful, Lord Jesus. May we see your goodness and your glory in new ways throughout this season of Lent. May we know the depths of your love for us more fully. May we feel the pain you endured for our sake, Jesus, and may we rejoice that you conquered every bit of evil when you rose to life again.

Draw us closer to your heart, that we might know you better and understand you more completely. May our actions reflect our hearts, and may we worship you through all that we say and do throughout the weeks to come.
