The 25th Anniversary of Father Chuck's Ordination to the Priesthood!

Looking at the five years I have been here at Saint Stephen's so far, I am reflecting with joy and gratitude to God for the blessings I am given in living out my calling to serve God's people as a priest of Jesus Christ. I am gazing back with wonder at how many inspired moments in prayer and encouraging words from spiritual guides helped me to stay true to my calling and begin the journey of intense college study and priestly formation, then how, in spite of occasions of questions and doubts, with God's wonderful grace and through the power of the Holy Spirit I was accepted into the major seminary with four years of graduate study in Sacred Scripture, theology, pastoral internships, daily worship and prayer, study and spiritual direction where I felt my gifts were able to be developed and prepared for my life as a priest for a parish congregation.

I felt God reassuring me that I was exactly where God was calling me to be throughout those four years of full time residence and intensive graduate study in the priestly formation program. My professors and pastoral mentors, my spiritual director and my nearly 30 classmates from dioceses from all around the United States and the world blessed me and helped me to recognize how I was able to be a blessing in allowing God, through them, to form me into a priest for the Church. With my family and friends joining the seminary community in Chicago I was ordained a deacon on December 12, 1998, then began preaching and ministering as a deacon at a parish near the seminary. The pastor and the people of that parish then became mentors for me on the last stretch of the journey toward my ordination to the priesthood on June 5, 1999. I am blessed with a life filled with happiness. My joy at answering God's call in my life to serve as a priest throughout these past 25 years has been its own blessing, but I am also humbled and overjoyed at the appreciation and encouragement I have received by the many members of the various parish congregations where I have served. I have been called to and served at a few different parishes over the past 25 years with many wonderful people in each one. However, my favorite parish to which God has called me is here at Saint Stephen's. Thank you for your prayers and support, thank you for your love and appreciation, thank you for your welcome five years ago and for your words of gratitude for my ministry here. Let us be a blessing to each other. -Father Chuck

Mission of the Month

GWEN'S GIRLS WILKINSBURG

A study by the Black Girls Equity Alliance in 2020 found that Black girls are 10 times more likely than white girls to be referred to juvenile justice, and the majority of arrests are for minor offenses that are not safety related. Along with other programming, Gwen's Girls created Caring Connections for YOUth to intervene before law enforcement is called, and the organization is expanding in even more ways. Gwen's Girls offers programming for girls from third through 12th grade in Allegheny County to empower them, offering help with schoolwork, life skills and a place where they can be themselves. Their new program, Caring Connections for YOUth, has already helped 130 families in its first year. It's designed to interrupt the school-toprison pipeline by providing services and support for kids and families before a situation escalates to the justice system.
