East End Cooperative Ministry (EECM) was founded in 1970 as a collective response to changes in the East End community, born when local faith communities recognized that the troubles of the community were too great for any one of them to address alone. EECM was initially envisioned to serve the young, the elderly, and the poor of the area, as well as to promote interfaith events. Throughout its 50 years, EECM has continued to respond to changing community needs through its many programs and services. Its mission statement is simple: **EECM changes the lives of the people facing the impacts of poverty**

EECM offers:

Food Pantry

Their Food Pantry provides an array of fresh produce and dairy, as well as refrigerated, frozen, dry goods and shelf stable items for clients who may visit once a month. Hours are M-F 8:30am-10:30am & 11:30am-1:30pm.

Week Day Community Lunches

Their kitchen serves a hot lunch free of charge to all who are in need, no registration required. Anyone can take advantage of their well-balanced lunches. Hours M-F 12 noon to 12:45pm with bagged lunches available until 1pm.

Housing Services / Emergency Shelter / 150-Day Recovery House

Their shelter helps individual adults become stable by meeting their basic needs with shelter and food. Those in the emergency shelter also receive assistance obtaining benefits, accessing health care, and locating permanent housing. Once a person achieves stability in the shelter program, Case Management and the Education Employment team will work with them to build on their strengths, and develop a pathway to higher levels of self-sufficiency and self-fulfillment.

Children & Youth Services

Children & Youth Services reaches out to young people in the Pittsburgh Public Schools (K-12) to help them work toward a brighter future. Their programs help children and youth succeed in school, make healthy decisions, explore new interests, set personal goals, and most importantly, learn to value themselves. Services include: Summer Camp, In-School & After School Outreach and Recreational Programs.

<u>All in need are welcome to their services</u>. Sadly, food & shelter insecurity exists among many of our friends and neighbors and EECM is a nonjudgemental space to help those in need. They are located at **6140 Station Street Pittsburgh PA 15206**, in the East Liberty neighborhood, near Home Depot and the Social Security office.
